Dear President Biden, Speaker of the House Johnson, and Senate Majority Leader Schumer,

I write to relay Connecticut's urgent concerns with regard to obtaining additional federal dollars for our cashstarved heating assistance program.

More than 33,000 applications for the <u>Connecticut Energy Assistance Program</u> were approved between Sept. 1 and Nov. 4, according to the state <u>Department of Social Services</u>. That's 23% higher than early November numbers last winter, when the program went on to shatter the 100,000-household mark for the first time.

As Senate Republican Leader, and as someone who once worked for the Connecticut Department of Social Services in its energy assistance program, I am quite familiar with the families who rely on this program to heat their homes during cold New England winters.

Simply put: Action must be taken. Lives hang in the balance. Burdens are placed on municipalities across Connecticut to deal with the consequences.

Majority leadership here at the State Capitol has taken a wait-and-see approach to this crisis and hopes Congress will provide the additional funding. But hope is not a strategy, as I am certain you would agree.

I urge you to work in bipartisan fashion to approve supplemental LIHEAP funding. In the absence of state assistance which I continue to press for, we need federal help.

Thank you all for your service to our country and your attention to this crisis.
